## Power in Art

Join six of the Princeton University Art Museum docents as they explore a new theme and guide you through different aspects of power in art including the power of hope; the power of the church vs the power of the marketplace in 17th century European art; the power of line, shape and color; the power of stories in art; and power themes in Chinese and African tribal art. The course will take place in the Princeton University Art Museum and will include an hour of interactive lecture and an hour of small group activity. The groups will look closely at a small number of art works, sharing thoughts, opinions and individual perspectives.

No advanced preparation is required for this course. Art is largely subjective and what you see and what you think matters. Bring your open mind, be prepared to share your opinions and learn from each other in the class!
