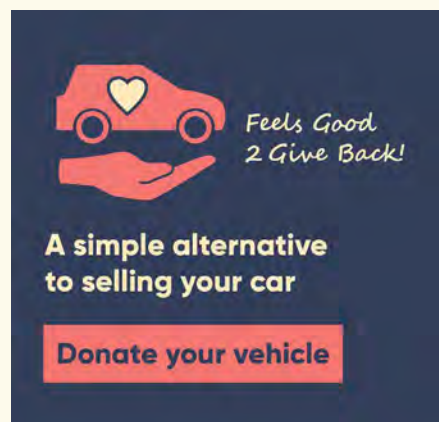

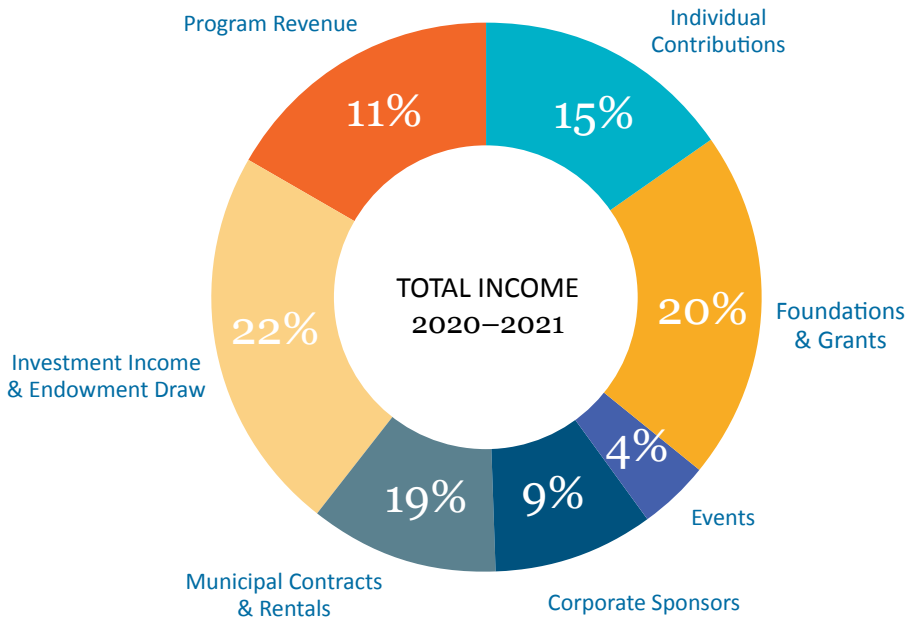

PIC Princeton is designed to assist people who live in Princeton — and nearby communities — who seek support as they navigate the complex array of health and social services communities.

How does it work?

PSRC professional staff will meet with you, in our office or your home, to understand your needs and situation. We will help you create a plan of action to meet those needs. This may involve one or a series of meetings.

Are there fees?

PIC Princeton services are free. However, PSRC is a non-profit organization, relying on fees, grants, and donations. Your contribution enables us to continue to offer these services to everyone in the community.

If your assessment indicates that you need a higher level of care, we will connect you with appropriate providers.

Services include:

- Linkage to community resources
- Individual and family consultations
- Support groups
- Education
- Volunteer visitors
- Assistance with care planning
- Advocacy
- Assistance with benefit applications
