Honoring Hazel Stix

From its beginning in 1974, Hazel Stix has been an active participant and supporter of the Princeton Senior Resource Center. Jocelyn Helm, founder, and first executive director, shared, “Hazel was very important to PSRC in the early days. She was one of a very small group who truly advocated for the establishment of the organization and its importance in and to the greater Princeton community. She was actively involved in outreach and recruitment to help PSRC grow from its earliest days.” Currently on the Advisory Council, Hazel first began with chairmanships of membership and fundraising, recognizing that one could not exist without the other.



Born and raised in New York City, Hazel started college at Washington University in St. Louis and transferred to NYU where she completed her bachelor’s degree. Her intention to attend the Columbia School of Social Work, located on Fifth Avenue, came into conflict with her wedding plans and a residence with her husband, Tom, in the “Butler Tract,” the graduate student housing on Harrison Street. She spent a very pleasant four years there, keeping busy with volunteer work, including two years of being president of the new Hadassah chapter of mainly young active grad student wives.

Over the years Hazel was involved in many diverse areas, she was on the boards of Trinity Counseling and Planned Parenthood, Compassion and Choice, Chairman of the United Jewish Appeal and on the board, and honored, by the American Jewish Committee. In 1980 she was asked by the Committee of Concerned Scientists, of which Tom was a member, to accompany a woman physicist to Russia to meet with Russian dissident scientists and assure them, during this hostile period, that they had support in the U.S.

Current board member Phil Carchman shared “Hazel’s impact on the Princeton community has been profound. The scope of her good deeds is only matched by her remarkable “wingspan” in bringing together so many people in so many positive ways. She is a remarkable person!”

Hazel's journey and impact stands as an example to us all for the boundless possibilities of a life dedicated to service, community, family, and friends.

Beloved by her late husband Tom Stix, and late partner Harold Borkan, Hazel enjoys a close loving relationship with her two children and their spouses, Susie and Chip Fisher and Michael and Ami Stix, and with her four grandsons and one granddaughter-in-law, Will, Matt and Kate, Jonathan, and Benjamin.

PSRC is extraordinarily grateful for Hazel's abundant generosity, her exemplary leadership and advocacy, and her profound support, for almost fifty years of our mission to help older adults thrive.

Vaccine Navigator Program: Assisting Older Adults with Vaccinations

Established in winter 2021, the Vaccine Navigator program has assisted 800+ older adults in scheduling and securing vaccines. With 125 volunteers speaking seventeen languages, it has reached diverse communities. Partnering with the Princeton Health Department, the program organized community vaccine clinics and informative Town Hall presentations on Covid-19 and vaccination health.

PSRC received a \$150,000 grant from the National Council on Aging and the federal Administration for Community Living, reviving the Vaccine Navigator initiative in January 2023.

The new initiative focuses on vaccine health for older adults, including Covid-19 and influenza. Partnering with community organizations for tailored outreach and assistance to older adults helps to address their social service needs. Positive feedback from recipients highlights the program's effectiveness, with one expressing gratitude for the convenient clinics and support provided by PSRC.



- Assistance with benefit applications




